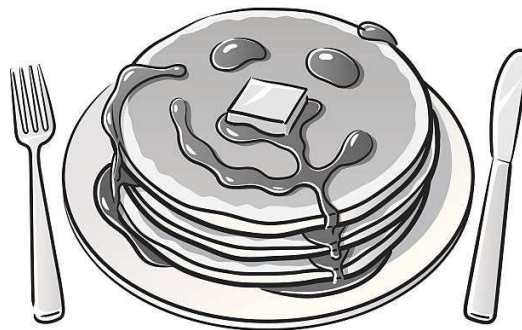

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All persons to be admissible as members of this Society on payment of six dollars (\$6.00) annually.
2. The exhibitor will be charged an entry fee in all classes of sections 1-9 in addition to the membership fee – except in “Special classes”. Take note of such fee at the top of each section.
THE ENTRY FEE IS PAID AT THE TIME OF ENTRY TO THE TREASURER (e-transfer accepted)
3. An exhibitor will be allowed an unlimited number of entries free with the membership fee in Sections 10 to 20 inclusive. But must only have 1 entry per class. Grains, seeds, roots and garden produce and fruit must have been grown on land occupied by the exhibitor and it must be their property.
4. No more than two official premiums, other than champions or specials, shall be awarded to any one animal or article.
5. The judges have it in their power to withhold any premium for any animal or article which they may consider unworthy of same, unless appealed: from as is hereinafter provided.
6. The judge’s decision in all cases is final. All protests from the judge’s decision must be made in writing while the judge and exhibits are still on the grounds, and accompanied by the sum of \$25.00. Should the protest be sustained the \$25.00 will be returned to the protesting party. Otherwise, the money will become the property of the society. Parties openly objecting to a decision in any case shall forfeit claims to prizes they would otherwise have obtained.
7. In Sections 10 to 20 inclusive there will be only one entry per exhibitor allowed.
8. All articles mentioned in Sections 10 to 20 inclusive to be exhibited by the maker and shall not have been previously exhibited at Harding.
9. The Harding Agricultural Society is registered with the Canadian Cattle Identification Agency (CCIA), therefore all cattle must all be tagged with the CCIA tag/button.
10. Cows shall have produced young at least within a year to the date of the fair, or be visibly in calf.
11. Articles in the display buildings to be picked up at 5:00 pm.
12. No persons allowed in the ring except judges and directors, and no person allowed to speak to the judges while on duty.
13. No more than one prize will be given for different articles except livestock, under the same heading in the prize list, to any one person even though awarded in the case of only one exhibitor, no more than two prizes will be awarded in horses.
14. Neither the Society nor any of the Officials hereof shall be responsible for loss or injury to the exhibits, though care will be taken to prevent such loss or damage.
15. No exhibitor’s name shall appear on any animal or article exhibited until after it has been judged. This rule will be strictly observed.
16. All entries mentioned in Sections 10 to 20 inclusive to be in the display buildings by 9:00 am. All stock to be on the grounds by 9:00 am.
17. All articles mentioned in Sections 10 to 20 inclusive will be judged in the morning, commencing at 9:30 a.m. Heavy horses, miniatures at 10:00 a.m. and cattle will be judged at 9:00 a.m. Light horses and ponies start at 9:00 a.m.
18. Deadline for entries will be 10:00 p.m. the Wednesday before the fair. Double entry fee will be charged for entries in all classes made after the deadline.
19. Exhibitors moving stock from the grounds before 6:00 pm will forfeit any prizes that they may have been awarded for the said article or stock. This rule will be strictly adhered to.
20. No articles or animals to compete unless entry has been made with the Secretary
21. Exhibits, which may have been erroneously entered, may, at the discretion of the judge and director in charge, be transferred to the proper classes previous to judging.
22. When respectfully requested to do so, the judges are expected to give reasons for their decisions, stating what constitutes points of excellence in the class of animals or articles being considered, and pointing out the superiority over the other articles being considered, and pointing out the superiority over the other.
23. Bedding will be supplied. No roping off stalls prior to fair day, no exceptions, first come, first serve.
24. Should funds of the Society be insufficient to pay all awards, the Society reserves the right to withhold prize money sufficient enough to balance the receipt of the fair. **Prize money will be paid out on or before the first of October.**

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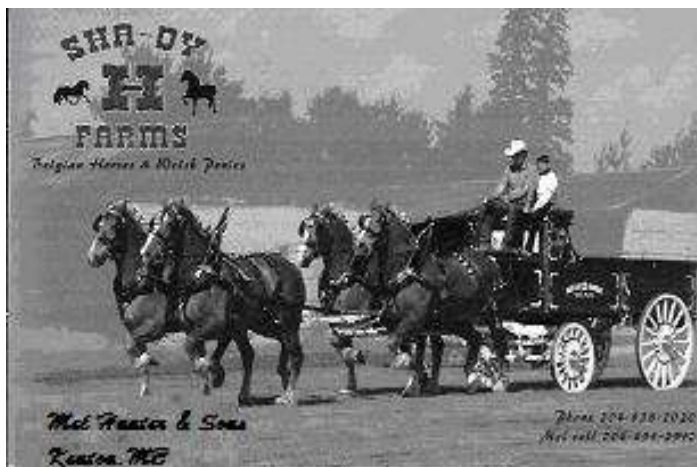

- All horses and ponies must be on the grounds and entries paid no later than 8:30 am on Friday morning.
- A **pony** will be defined as 14.2 hands and under. A horse will be defined as **over 14.2 hands** unless breed standards of registered horses indicate otherwise. Any horse or pony may be measured by a competent official.
- All ages of exhibitors shall be determined by January 1 of calendar year.
- **NO PARKING** will be allowed in the area from north of the barn to the show ring. Please keep this area clear. This will be strongly enforced and you will be asked to move if you are blocking the path to the show ring.
- Stallions may not be exhibited by anyone under 18 years of age.
- No reserved stalls – first come, first served basis. Straw is provided for bedding.
- Hay must be provided by exhibitor.
- **KEEP STABLE AREA CLEAN! PLEASE CLEAN OUT STALLS BEFORE LEAVING.** Thank you!

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Description: The ideal ranch horse should be forward moving while performing timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, demonstrating an obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. Each horse will work individually, performing the gait maneuvers in both directions, as well as a stop and backup. The horse will also have to navigate 2 – 3 obstacles.

Rules:

- Riders MAY use two hands on the reins and touching the saddle horn is acceptable
- Working tack preferred
- No braided/banded mains or tail extensions allowed.



2022 MANITOBA AG SOCIETY PROVINCIAL QUILT COMPETITION RULES:

Sponsored by: Manitoba Association of Agricultural Societies

1. Competition is open to all quilt exhibitors.
2. The judging criteria are included in the "Judging Standards" Fair Book.
3. Quilts may be entered in four categories:
 - hand quilted
 - domestic/mid arm – fabric is manipulated by hand under a fixed machine
 - track (mid/long arm) – this includes where the machine rides on wheels and moves over the fabric and the machine is hand guided. No computer programmed quilting will be allowed.
 - computerized quilting – where the quilting design has been computer programmed
4. The quilt must be completely done by the person submitting the quilt.
5. No commercial quilting will be allowed (machine quilted by someone other than the exhibitor).
6. Quilts must have an appropriate title and give appropriate credit to pattern designer if not original.
7. Quilts must be clean; any with stains and/or markings; pet hair will not be accepted
8. Quilts must have a perimeter of at least 240 inches (590 cm) to be considered for the competition.
9. A fabric quilt label must be attached to the bottom right corner on the backside of the quilt entry. • Labels must

be covered at all judging levels.

10. Quilts must be delivered/packaged in a durable and labeled clear plastic bag for handling.

11. Quilters must sign a release form when the quilt is entered at the local event.

12. A Judges Score Sheet will be distributed to all Societies, which must be used to judge the quilts. Any quilt not scoring 70 or more points will not qualify for the District or Provincial Competition.

13. Each Society may select up to eight quilts (2 hand quilted, 2 domestic, 2 track and 2 computerized) at their Fair to participate in the District Competition. Up to a total of eight quilts will be chosen at the District

Competition to go on to the Provincial Competition.

14. Exhibitors may enter more than one quilt in this competition. However, they may only have one in each category advance to the Provincial Competition.

15. Any quilt may be entered in competition at as many Fairs as the exhibitor wishes. However, it may only represent the Society where it was first entered in the Provincial Competition and won. The exhibitor must advise Societies at the time of entry if their quilt is a winner at a previous fair.

16. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in the Provincial Competition, the runner-up quilt with a score higher than 70 will be selected to represent the society in the District Competition.

17. At the district level prize monies will be awarded for the top quilts in each category. At the provincial finals, there will be prize monies available in the Hand Quilted, Domestic, Track and Computerized Quilting Categories.

18. All District Winners/Provincial Entries will be held for display at the Provincial Quilt Finals; and are encouraged to be available for the 2023 Red River Ex. Quilters are responsible to deliver/pick up their quilt(s).

19. MAAS will take the utmost care of the quilts; however, quilt owners are responsible for insuring their own quilts, if they so choose. The sponsors, societies and M.A.A.S. will not be liable for damage or loss.
